#### **NEIGHBORHOOD RECIPE BOX**

Since August 8 is *National Sneak Zucchini onto your Neighbor's Porch Day*, we thought we could be creative about it. This is a great recipe that uses lemons, herbs and zucchini straight from the garden.

#### Zucchini Parmesan Herb Bread

6 cups flour
2 cups zucchini, grated
½ cup parmesan cheese, grated
10 tsp baking powder
1 tsp baking soda
3 tsp salt
2/3 cup butter or margarine
2 cups milk
4 tbs lemon juice
4 eggs
6 tbs chopped chives, parsley or mixed herbs to taste

Drain grated Zucchini. Press out excess moisture before using.

Add lemon juice to milk and set aside. The rind can be finely grated and added to the mix.

Combine dry ingredients, herbs and Parmesan Cheese

Melt butter or margarine in pan. Add to milk and mix.

Combine wet and dry ingredients.

Pour into two greased loaf pans. Bake at 350 for 50-60 minutes or until done.



#### TRAFFIC UPDATE


Several people asked whether or not we could have landscaping in the

new medians on Fruitdale at Southwest to make the intersection look nicer. DOT has responded that this median is an extension of existing VTA designs. The median design was handled through a public process and is not subject to change at this time. In addition, there is a need to keep the intersection and the crossing guards highly visible to traffic.



With the recent paving of Leigh Avenue and other streets in the area, many of our stop sign markings


