The most recent Draft Supplemental Environmental Report will have closed the public comment period by the time you receive this. The Board of Trustees will meet to discuss certifying the DSEIR in July. SONA compiled a response as did several local residents and the Burbank/Del Monte NAC.

The current DSEIR attempts to fold in all existing or underway projects to clean up past issues. The timeline for the DSEIR is short because the campus intends to initiate a new DSEIR for the future improvements as required by state law. Per law, the campus must have a long range plan in place.

Highway 280 Metering Project

Board President Michael LaRocca along with Board members Steve Kline and Randi Kinman recently attended a meeting with the State's Caltrans Department, San Jose's Department of Transportation and the Valley Transportation Authority to review the plans for metering Highway 280 between Bascom and 10th/11th Streets. You may have seen detour signs, construction equipment and mysterious pavement markings along the exits. The metering project will regulate the number of cars accessing the freeway at the same time. This keeps freeway traffic moving without start and stop issues. The concern for local residents was how this would affect our surface streets. Some local ramps will be widened to two lanes. Meters will be installed far enough down the ramps to ensure traffic does not back up onto surface streets. The metering project will complete construction in the Summer 2011 period. SONA board members asked for extensive traffic count analysis prior to turning on the metering lights. This will allow us to completely analyze the existing traffic patterns as well as following changes.

Meters can be adjusted to accommodate high volumes. When traffic is at peak, the meters allow higher numbers of cars to go through.

Summer Cooling Stations

While we have had a mild start to summer, we can count on things heating up. Most homes in SONA are not equipped with air conditioning. That doesn't mean you can't find relief. The City of San Jose operates "cooling stations" at community centers and libraries, giving you and your family a break from the heat. Friends of Bascom on the Move

As we go to print, the City Council is deciding how to balance the budget and move forward for the next year. No matter what side of the budget issue you fall on, there is no doubt that promises made to our community and tens of thousands of residents were broken by the failure to ensure the Bascom Library opens on schedule.

This will not mean that residents give up on the library. It just means that tactics and strategy will change for the next few months.

The Bascom site was designed and constructed with the idea this could be a self sufficient site, generating power from solar panels and revenue from the on-site café.

A "Friends of Bascom Library" group has been formed to establish the long term connection between the community and library system. The Friends group has also connected with other groups around the city.

Friends groups coordinate volunteer efforts, work with staff to develop programs and raise funds to supplement services. Typical fund raising comes from events and sales, including the sale of used books donated by the community.

Our Friends group has already designed a logo and printed t-shirts that will kick start the fund raising drive while providing a great visual enhancement when residents appear before our city council.

Residents have been appearing at numerous meetings for the last few months to try and push our council into opening the new facility. If you are interested in joining the effort, please contact board member Steve Kline.

The Bascom Community Center was intended to be the District 6 full service community center hub. The Bascom Library was added to the site when placement of the District 1 library proved to be too difficult to implement. The site has been under construction for quite some time and is due to be completed in early Fall 2010. The current budget proposal could have ensured that the facility

opened on time, or delayed for a short period. Instead, there is no schedule for opening the facility in 2011 and possibly through 2012.
